

A QUICK HISTORICAL, POLITICAL, & SOCIAL OVERVIEW

Switzerland's constitution was adopted in 1848, and largely revised in 1874. The country is known to be neutral in many international affairs, and the government gives a lot of power to the people through referendums in its direct democracy systems. The political system avoids giving a lot of power to the federal government, and many of the power rest in its local government called Cantons. This is due to the large ethnic diversity within the country. The country has 4 official languages being French, German, Italian, and Romansh. The language os "Swiss" does not exist. The country has the most Nobel prize winners per capita, and the country is not a member of the EU. FreedomHouse gives Switzerland a rating of 96 meaning free, but recent laws have been accused of targeting minority groups.

LINDT CHOCOLATE FACTORY
